50% of wetlands lost








Map 6. Water stress according to drainage basins, circa 1995 [withdrawal-to-availability ratio]

0 - 0.2 0.2 - 0.4 more than 0.4 [low water stress] [mid water stress] [severe water stress]



















- Multi-purpose infrastructure

- Economic instruments (polluter-pays and user-pays)


