EU Water Law


- legally binding on EU Member States
- Transformation: EU law ⇒ national legislation
- implementation by EU Member States
 - enforcement by EU Commission
 - judicial review by EU Court of Justice
- domestic + transboundary water bodies


- integrated water resources management
