IWRA Partnership Projects





Global Water Security Issues with i-WSSM UNESCO and UNESCO IHP

- GWSI's 4th publication, Water Security and Cities – Integrated Urban Water
 Management, was released, with a webinar on Oct. 24 focusing on urban resilience.
- The 5th case study, Making Decisions for Climate Adaptation, is in final editing and set for early 2025 publication.
- Issue 6, themed Biodiversity and Water Security, is in final draft, with some chapters still under review; release date TBD.
- IWRA has a new 3-year agreement with UNESCO iWSSM for support on issues 7 and 8, with Raya Stephan replacing Mary Trudeau as Deputy Editor-in-Chief for both.



IWRA Partnership Projects

Smart Water Cities Project

with K-water & Asia Water Council

- The Smart Water Cities project with Kwater and Asia Water Council ended in 2023, achieving its main goals.
- Developed a tool to measure and compare urban water services globally through the Smart Water Cities Index.
- Project phases:
 - 2021: Defined Smart Water City concepts and standards.
 - 2022: Created the Smart Water
 Cities Index with 114 KPIs.
 - 2023: Tested the Index in Busan Eco Delta City and Semarang.
- Plans for 2025: Expand the Index with a new pilot city, aiming to present results at the IWRA Congress in December 2025.




